On **Sept. 24, 1947** the Translake with a cargo of crude oil was heading upstream when it collided with the coal carrying Milverton just west of Morrisburg. The Milverton's bunker tanks then began leaking and the entire vessel was soon consumed in flames. In the early morning of **July 14, 1970** the Eastcliffe Hall was westbound when it ran aground on Crysler Shoal and began taking on water. Six crew members and three passengers perished. However, thanks to the heroism of some on duty police constables, twelve others were rescued. **Ron Beaupre**
